Happy February Lightning Families!

On February 22, we invite the MCS community to stand up with MCS students and staff against bullying. We are launching the Meduxnekeag Anti-Bullying Policy and continuing education and interventions to increase positive behaviour traits and competencies with our students. Join us on February 7th at 6:30 pm in our cafeteria for a parent information session on the Anti-Bullying policy, as well as Internet Safety.

Since we are still in the midst of winter, there is a possibility that school may be dismissed early if poor weather develops. If we are required to do so, an early dismissal will be posted with the information on the MCS Home and School Facebook page, our website and we will also put out a talk mail message. To ensure the safety of all students K-6, one on one phone calls with parents will also occur. If we are unable to reach parents/guardians by phone, students will be sent to their normal end-of-day destination. Grades 7 and 8 students will be sent on their regular busses. It is important that students are well outfitted for outside play. Winter coats, pants, boots, hats, mitts and scarves are needed by all students K-8. Students play outside most days except on days when the "feels like" temperature dips below -17 degrees Celsius.
