## LETTER FROM THE PRINCIPAL

I am so excited to welcome you to a new school year! I hope everyone has enjoyed their summer and is ready to get back to learning. The MCS Parent/Student Handbook will be available online by Friday, September 5 and it will also be sent to you electronically. I encourage you to read it and connect with me if you have questions. It is important that your contact information be up to date in our system so that you can receive all the news from MCS. Please call us at 506 325 4434 to update your information. All K-3 students

are asked to pay a \$65 student fee. The student fee will cover all school supplies needed for the entire school year (except for backpacks, lunchboxes and indoor sneakers/phys.ed clothing). These monies will also be used throughout the school year to supplement costs for student activities, special events, guest speakers and performers as well as playground and school enhancements. Grades 4-8 student fees are \$85 which includes all school supplies as described above, as well as a tech fee to support our Technology Sustainability Plan. Student fees can be paid at any time by sending it in to your child's teacher or online at <https://anglophonewest.schoolcashonline.com>. Just follow the easy steps of setting up your account. The Bring Your Own Laptop Initiative (BYOL) is available for all middle school students. I encourage families to make that investment as it allows your child access to the school network and educational resources, at school and at home. Please contact your child's teacher or Vice-Principal Michael Liston at 506 325 4434 for more information about required specifications, etc. I would like to remind families of the electronic device/cell phone/smart watch policy. All these devices are banned from use from entry to exit at MCS. Students who bring these devices to school are doing so at their own risk and will be expected to always have the devices off their person through the school day. This means that the device would need to be in a LOCKED locker or in their book bag. The school day includes noon hour, recess, and early morning. It also includes field trips and after-hours activities. Any staff member who sees a student with a device (including a Smart watch), even if they are not using it, will have the student turn the device over to the office until the end of the school day. Repeated incidences of staff needing to take a device from individual students will result in disciplinary measures. Meduxnekeag Consolidated reserves the right to ban individual students from bringing an electronic device/phone to school as circumstances dictate. Note: students can use the office phone if needed. The MCS Anti-Bullying Policy and the Fair Notice Letter from the Superintendent are in the parent/student handbook. Please review and understand that our students' safety; emotionally, physically, and psychologically, is our main priority. Students who repeatedly and intentionally hurt other students (and staff) will be excluded from the school environment as per EECD Policy 703. The MCS staff will do all we can to teach, model, and reinforce expected positive behaviours to students. MCS has several outdoor learning spaces and students will be in these spaces regularly as well as going outside during morning recess (K-5) and the noon recess (all students). Students need to be dressed appropriately for outside learning and play. A last reminder is that MCS has water bottle filling stations, not water fountains. Please send your child to school with a refillable water bottle (labelled).
