MESSAGE FROM THE ADMINISTRATION

Happy February Lightning Families!

Through the month of February, we invite the MCS community to stand up with MCS students and staff against bullying. We are reviewing the Meduxnekeag Anti-Bullying Policy and continuing education and interventions to increase positive behaviour traits and competencies with our students. Since we are still in the midst of winter, there is a possibility that school may be dismissed early if poor weather develops. If we are required to do so, an early dismissal post will be put on the MCS Home and School Facebook page, the MCS website and we will also put out a talk mail message. To ensure the safety of all students K-6, one on one phone calls to parents will also occur. If we are unable to reach parents/guardians by phone prior to busses, students will be sent to their normal end-of-day destination. Grades 7 and 8 students will be sent on their regular busses.

Should we need to have a snow day or a bus delay, the local radio stations will have the information and it will also be available on the ASD-W website or you can call 506 453 5454 or 1 888 388 4455. MCS is located in Zone #3. It is important that students are well outfitted for outside play. Winter coats, pants, boots, hats, mitts and scarves are needed by all students K-8. Students play outside most days except on days when the "feels like" temperature dips below -17 degrees Celsius. Another reminder about end of day dismissal procedures. We ask that parent/guardians wait outside for students. We need to keep the lobby area clear for the heavy student traffic at that time of day. GUIDANCE CORNER
